



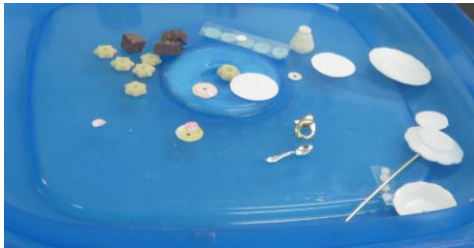
80's - 90's Tea Tray Part II

Finally, after being delayed a month due to snow storms, we were able to open Bag "B"



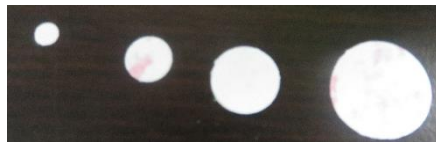
Locate the strip of blue beads, paint them with a couple of coats of gold nail polish before adding as the "feet" to your tray.



Use the tiny "half-pearls" for the feet of your tea pot.



Nice to see new members Maureen, and her daughter Grace, getting right into our Tea Tray project!



Take the smallest of the cut paper circles and wrap around the "handles" of the tray, then use the tiny gold beads to cover the holes at each end. Pictured left is Karen, returning from a 25-year absence! Welcome back, Karen!

Use Tacky glue to attach the decals to the plates – the largest on the bottom plate and luncheon plate, the middle size for the soup bowl. Sand off the nubs. The hole-punch size is used for the front of the cup, and one goes on the saucer.
